Worship (15 mins)	Read Psalm 139 and take time to sit quietly with its vision of God's infinite care and how he values us. You might like to worship with the song, <i>Goodness of God:</i>

Word (20-25 mins)	Last week, Dan opened our series on Growing Together with the theme of kindness . This Sunday, Steve talked about personhood .	
	What is personhood? It is the intrinsic value that each person holds – not reliant on any particular characteristic or competence, but given as a gift.	
	Think about how people are valued in everyday life. What measures and criteria are used? For example, physical beauty, bank balance, character, etc.	
	The Bible teaches us that our value lies deeper. Look up and read out the following Bible verses and talk about how these speak of our value as human beings.	
	Genesis 1:27, Psalm 139:13–16, Romans 5:6-7, 2 Cor. 5:14–15, 1 John 4:7–12	
	A summary might be that we are created in God's image, redeemed at great cost and loved deeply and forever (beloved)	
	Talk about how these truths, if understood and lived out, might transform us as a community and strengthen our involvement in God's mission.	
EXTRA	Steve's sermon took in the story of Leah and her journey discovering her valued as one beloved of God. As an alternative to the Word ideas above, you might like to read Leah's story in Genesis 29:14b–35 and reflect together on the journey she makes – from 'unloved' to beloved and free.
